

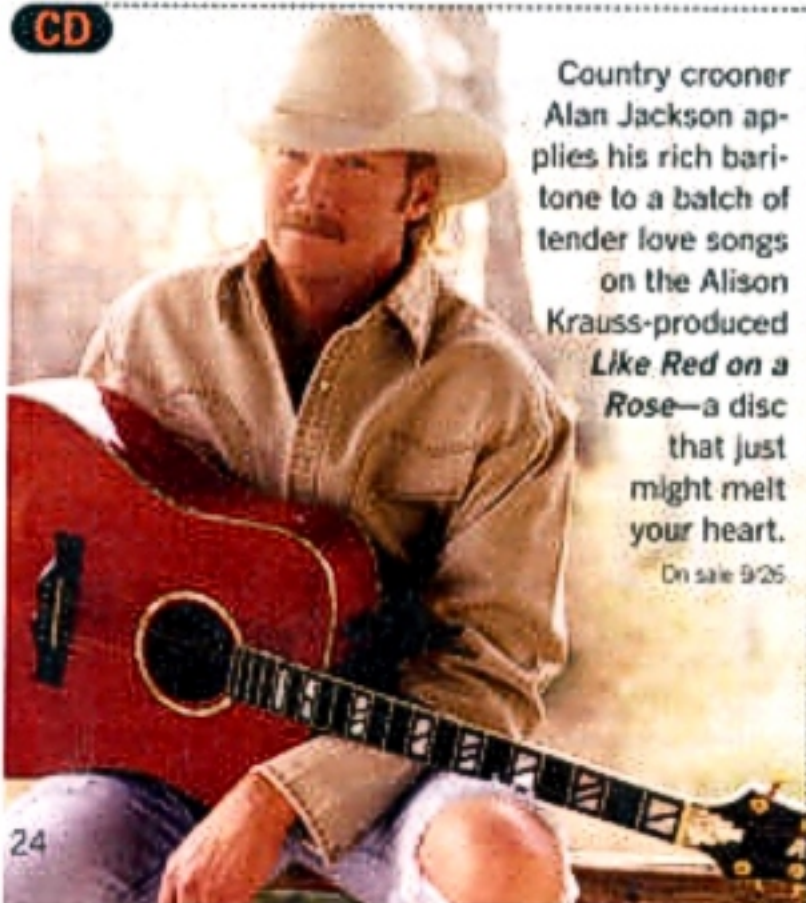

## MOVIE

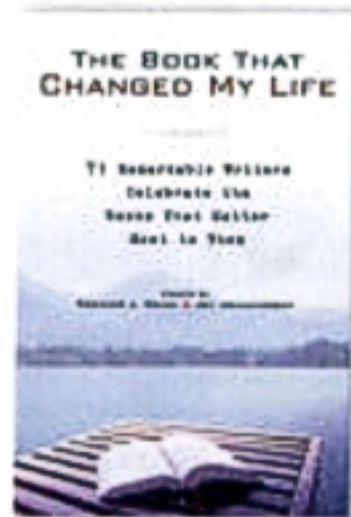
